GENERAL REGULATIONS AND CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

Exhibitor's attention is drawn to the information contained in the Australian Alpaca Association Ltd. Showing Rules. Showing Rules will apply to the running of this show.

Handlers must wear white dustcoats and appropriate footwear in the show ring. The handler must wear and clearly display the alpaca exhibit number while in the show ring.

All alpacas (except wethers) must be AAA registered and ear tagged with an approved brass ear tag displaying the IAR number. NOTE if there is no ear tag present in the ear of an alpaca then official AAA confirmation in hard copy must be provided by the exhibitor to the Chief Steward that the ear tag has recently been lost and a replacement ear tag has been ordered and paid for, otherwise the exhibit will be disqualified. All wethers must be castrated. No alpaca presented for showing shall exhibit any sign of illness or disfigurement.

The age classification for entries is to be taken as the day of the show, eg. an alpaca that turns 12 months of age on the day of the show is to be entered in the 12 to under 18 months section.

An alpaca is to be shown in the appropriate colour class, when it is predominantly that colour. Any colour variation shall be assessed at the time of inspection. Classes may be combined or joined at the discretion of the Chief Steward.

Where possible the requested number of pens will be provided, however the show committee may have to allocate pens with due consideration to the total number of entries received. As space is limited a maximum number of entrants per exhibitor may have to be enforced, if applicable discussion will occur with the exhibitor and they will be able to nominate the entrant/s to be withdrawn. Please advise if you are prepared to share a pen with another exhibitor.

Alpacas must be penned in their allotted pen by the nominated time to allow inspection to commence promptly and exhibitors are asked to stay with their animals till their inspection is completed. Pen allocation shall be on the basis of the JD Map and exhibits shall not be moved without the agreement of the Chief Steward. Q - Alpaca exhibits shall be treated the same as for MN1. Exhibitors must keep their pen clean and tidy and provide appropriate attention to their alpacas throughout the show. Exhibitors are required dismantle their pens at the completion of the show and dispose of straw into the appropriate bins before leaving.

Requests for clarification, complaints, appeals and/or protests on the day of the show are to be directed to the Chief Steward. The Chief Steward shall make their determination in accordance with the AAA Showing Rules.

Exhibitors enter at their own risk and the CCH Region, the AAA and the Show Committee shall not be responsible for any loss damage or injury to any exhibit, property or person from any cause whatsoever.

Placings will be awarded at the discretion of the judge. Ribbons will be awarded for placing's and champions. Trophies will be awarded for Supreme Champion.

NOTE: Sires progeny classes may be entered on the day of the show before 12:00 noon or time nominated on the day. The Suri classes will be run first.

Special Note

All participants are reminded they if you are using a vehicle that has/is also used for transporting horses this must have been thoroughly cleaned as per the notices issued during the Equine Influenza outbreak.

During your visit to the show you are also advised that at no time are you permitted to visit the stable area or approach any horses that may be onsite.
